You are invited to attend the upcoming Smart Growth Workshop on June 24th, 2014 from 8:30am – 3:00pm at the Lockhart State Park Recreation Hall, located 4179 State Park Road in Lockhart. The goal of the workshop is to better equip decision makers so that they are able to consider the impacts of nonpoint source pollution in their daily activities.

Topics addressed in the workshop will include:

- linkages between land use types, water quality, and community character
- reducing storm water runoff volume and improving water quality through use of Low Impact Development (LID) techniques such as use of permeable pavements, rain gardens, vegetated swales, “curbless” streets, and others to enhance flood control
- other issues that are relevant to decision makers like you.

The workshop will be a combination of in-class presentations and outdoor demonstrations. Dr. Fouad Jaber, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Specialist in Integrated Water Resources Management, will explain how different Smart Growth techniques can help mitigate the harmful effects of urbanization on stormwater volume and water quality. The workshop is hosted by the Plum Creek Watershed Partnership as part of a continued effort to implement the Plum Creek Watershed Protection Plan (<http://plumcreek.tamu.edu>).
